

HONORS FOR COMMENCEMENT ACTIVITIES

The honor list shall consist of approximately the highest 15 percent of the class. The honor list of pupils may be given preference by leading the processional and in seating arrangements at commencement exercises. Students may or may not be designated "Valedictorian" and "Salutatorian" according to current practice at the school or the judgment of the administration and faculty. All other graduating seniors shall be arranged in alphabetical order without reference to academic achievement.

In computing class ranking for the determination of honors, all subjects that carry credit must be considered (majors and minors) irrespective of the number of subjects carried in any semester.

The method of computing numerical equivalents, based on subjects meeting five times a week, shall be as follows:

Marks	Points
A	4
B	3
C	2
D	1
E	0

For subjects which do not meet five times a week, the numerical value of marks shall be such fractional part of the whole value of the mark as the number of days the subject is taught is to five. Thus, the numerical value of the mark of "A" in physical education, meeting two times a week, would be two-fifths of four, or one and six-tenths.

All final marks received by students in grades nine through the first half of the twelfth grade shall be considered in point ranking except in the case of early graduation.

Students transferring from one school to another, for valid reasons, within the county shall have their credits accepted at face value and shall be considered for honors.
