

PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF CHAPTER 61, ARTICLE 6, SECTION 14A OF THE WEST VIRGINIA CODE, which provided that, "No person not a student in regular attendance, shall loiter in or about any school, school building or school grounds in violation of posted rules or regulations governing the use of any such school without written permission from the principal" violation of which is a misdemeanor subject to a fine up to \$500 and/or imprisonment in the county jail for up to one (1) year, the following rules and regulations shall be in effect in all Mingo County Schools, including but not limited to all secondary, elementary, kindergarten, and special education schools, buildings, and grounds, as of 21st day of July, 1975:

- a. No one, including official employees, students in regular attendance at the school, nor the general public shall be permitted to enter in or remain upon any school, school building, or school grounds before or after the regularly appointed school hours without written permission or authorization from the principal of the school.
- b. No one except official employees and students in regular attendance at the school shall enter in or remain upon any school, school building, or school grounds, during regularly appointed school hours without written permission or authorization from the principals of the school.
- c. The principal shall have power to grant or revoke such permission of authorization at his discretion, including the power to grant or revoke permission to be in attendance at extra-curricular activities at the school at the principal's discretion. Such discretion shall always be exercised in accordance with the policies of the Board of Education.
- d. "Official employees" shall mean teachers aides, secretaries, cooks, janitors, custodians, maintenance workers, and others who are actually hired by the Mingo County Board of Education to perform a designated duty or job during agreed upon hours.
- e. These rules are made pursuant to the power granted the board of education in West Virginia in Chapter 18, Article 5, Section 13, of the West Virginia Code, and shall be posted in conspicuous places, forthwith at all schools in Mingo County.
