

We encourage parents and concerned citizens to visit our schools. The public needs to be involved in the schools.

Visitors, upon entering the schools, need to go to the Central Office and check with the Principal before visiting in the school. The classroom should never be disturbed by anyone inadvertently entering the classroom. The learning process can be hurt.

The school is not to be used as a baby-sitting station. School personnel should never bring their pre-school age children to school to keep them during the day because they do not have a baby-sitter. This is not to say that their pre-school age children cannot visit for a short time, but this too should be kept to a minimum.

Since we live very near our neighboring State of Kentucky, we feel that when their school is out we should not have their students visiting our schools. This can be a problem for all.

It is not uncommon for a visitor from a distant area to be visiting with relatives and friends. We do not mind a visit in the schools from these visitors but, there again, it should be kept to a minimum and certainly they should have permission from the Principal before visiting.
